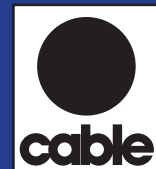


It'll be all white on the night

We heard what Stevie B had to say about Cable last week – give us your account of the space... what's it like?

This place is the business. I first saw it last year in about May when it was a damp, empty space and even then I could see the huge potential. The vaulted arches are beautiful and give it so much character. God knows I've seen enough railway arches in my day, but Cable is in a class of its own. Add to that the passion and creativity of creator Euan, the technical genius of Stevie B, some seriously stylish design work and the most bad ass sound system in the capital and you're looking at London's next mainstream super club.

You've worked with White Party before – are you their UK contact now?

I've known Robert for years and Stevie and I wanted the first gay event at Cable to be a big, well-known quality brand. We first approached Robert with the idea when we were on the Alternative Holidays event in Greece last year and he's been interested since day one. He was looking for the perfect venue for the White Party, and Stevie was in the

Are you gonna stick around in London for a while now?

For the time being, yes, but me and my lovely fiancé are building a house in Caraguatuba, Brazil, with four bedrooms, a swimming pool and it's two minutes from the beach!
